

A FIELD FULL OF FLOWERS

from age 6

preparation time: 5 min

duration: 45-60 min

MATERIALS

- Large sheets of white paper
- Watercolour like Creall Tint
- Poster paint like Creall Basic color
- Brushes like the Creall Trixi brush
- Small white paper circles
- Small scissors
- Cotton swabs
- Glue
- Wrapping paper

LEARNING OBJECTIVE

Explore the elementary parts of flowers.

Tip: rather not use gift wrapping?
Replace it with, for example, colourful
old brochures.

Show a photo of a flower and explain the different parts. Divide the class into groups of 3 to 4 pupils and give each group a large sheet of paper.

The children will be colouring the entire sheet with watercolours. With cotton swabs and poster paint they will dab the paper circles. These are the hearts of the flowers.

Let the children cut flowers from the gift wrapping. The petals and the hearts will be glued onto the painted paper. It is not if problem if the petals are overlapping.

Finally, the pupils will be painting additional leaves (the chalice) and stems to the flowers.
