

LESSON PLAN: ENDANGERED ANIMALS

- Age: from age 8
- Learning Area: English, science
- Preparation time: 5 minutes
- Duration: 60 minutes

WHAT DO YOU NEED?

- Poster paint such as Creall Eco color
- Air-drying modelling clay such as Creall Do & dry
- Computer/laptop
- Old paper and cardboard
- Glue such as Creall Coll
- Scissors
- Paper
- Brushes
- Pencil

WHAT WILL YOU BE DOING?

You will learn more about an endangered species and create a habitat for it.



STEP 1


Choose an endangered species that appeals to you. You can use https://www.twinkl.nl/teachingwiki/endangered-animals, for example.



STEP 2

Search for and write down information about the animal. Answer the following questions, for example:


- 1. What is the name of the animal?
- 2. What does the animal eat?
- 3. Where does the animal live?
- 4. What conditions are good for the animal (forest, warm, cold, sand, saltwater, etc.)?
- 5. Why is the animal endangered?



STEP 3

Paint a picture of the animal. Paste it onto the paper on which you have collected the information. This is the animal's passport.

Use modelling clay, cardboard, and paper to craft the perfect habitat for your animal.



STEP 4


Once the modelling clay is dry, paint the habitat.

Ages 10-12: think about and write a short plan to help preserve the species in the wild.

Present your habitat to the rest of the class. What choices did you make and why?
