- 'Waste' to reuse
- Brushes like Creall Gussow
- Glue such as Creall Hobby glue
- Scissors

LEARNING OBJECTIVE

Age 6 t/m 9: realise that human intervention on the earth affects the natural balance. Exploring the aspect of 'environment' such as environmental pollution.

Age 10 t/m 12: investigating the influence of our consumption pattern on the environment (waste problem). Realising the importance of preserving nature and caring for the environment.

Discuss the waste problem. Where does it come from? What impact does it have on nature? Why is waste separation and recycling important? Adjust the conversation to the level of the students.

Give each student a box or old plastic container as a base for the waste monster. Then have the students choose garbage to decorate the monster with.

The students make their waste monster. They make sure that the waste is easy to throw into the monster and that it is clear which waste has to go in.

When the waste monsters are ready, the students continue to paint and decorate them with waste and poster paint. If any waste is left over, the students sort it by putting it into the correct monsters.
