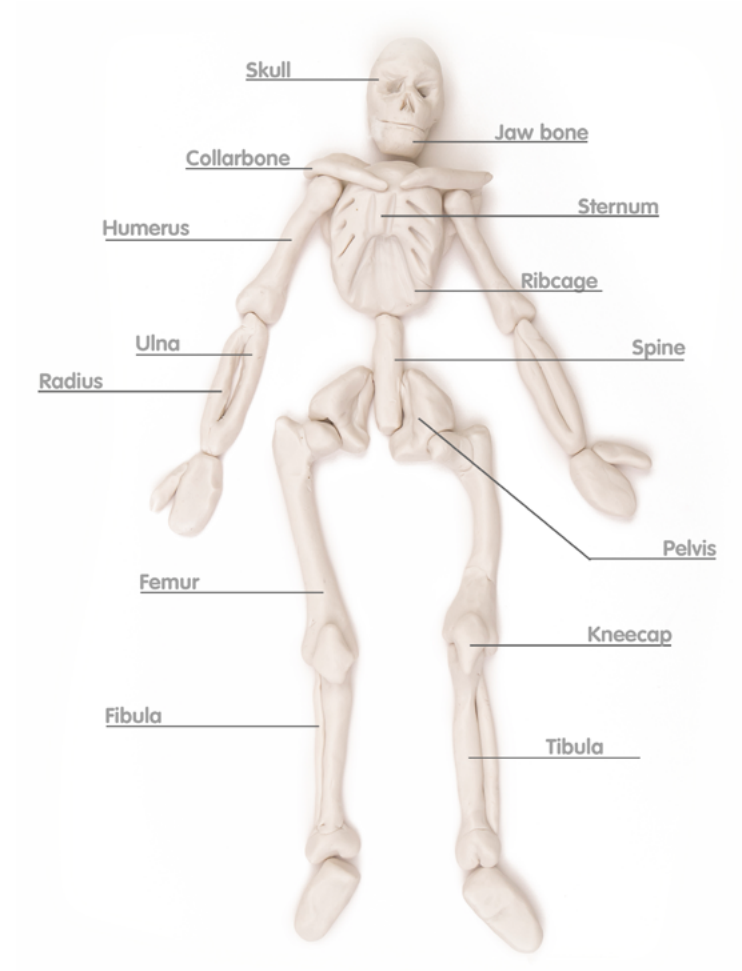

- Image of the human skeleton

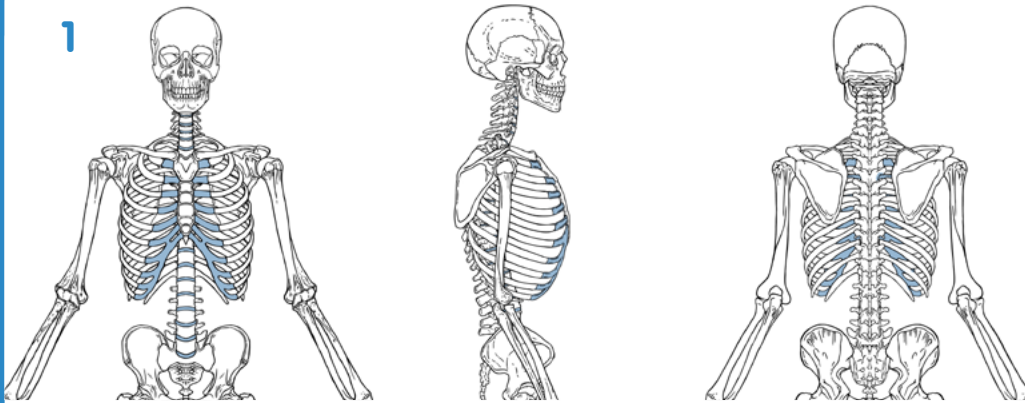
LEARNING OBJECTIVE

Learning about the construction and function of the skeleton

Show the human skeleton. Ask about and discuss the functions and names of various bones. Let the students feel a couple of their own bones, like their collarbone or knee cap.

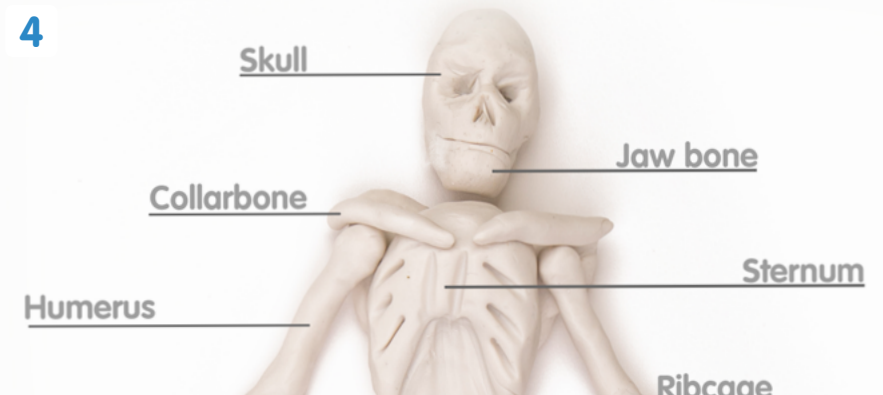
The students will sculpt parts of the skeleton out of clay. Have them make the bones that you talked about with more details.

Let the children put the parts of the skeleton on the paper in the correct order. How and where are the parts attached?

Once the skeletons are finished, the students should write down the names of the bones that they learned.
