- Glow-in-the-dark paint such as Creall Glow
- Wax crayons such as Creall Waxy

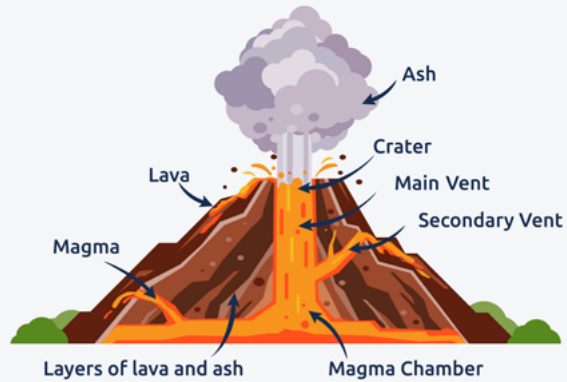
LEARNING OBJECTIVE

Explore which of the earth's processes could lead to natural disasters. Research elements of the natural landscape and their origin.



VOLCANO

Could your students name a volcano? Do they know how it works? Explain how volcanoes form. Discuss the effects of volcanic eruptions on humans and nature in the environment. Give all students coloured and white paper.

2



Let the students draw the outside of a volcano on the coloured paper. Then they cut open the volcano and fold the coloured paper aside.

3



Stick the white paper behind the cut open coloured paper. On this, the students draw the inside of the volcano: the magma hearth, the crater and possibly old craters or ash layers.

Have students paint the magma in the volcano and the lava from the volcano (like an eruption) using glow-in-the-dark paint.
