- A3 drawing paper
- White round paper
- White, brown and yellow poster paint such as Creall Dacta colour
- Thick brushes such as Creall Kids brush balloon
- Coloured paper
- Scissors
- Adhesive tape
- Glue

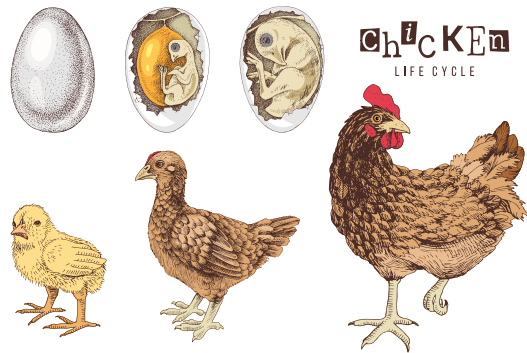
## LEARNING OBJECTIVE

Discovering the elementary stages of growth and development of animals.



# WHAT GROWS FROM THE EGG?

1



Discuss the life cycle of the chicken: from egg to chick to chicken and back to the egg again. Show supporting pictures on the IWB.

2



Let the children paint with the back of the brushes. By making circular movements with the brown paint, the eggs are formed. The pupils do the same with the yellow paint on the white round paper. Now the chick is formed.

3



The children stick the egg with the chick on the drawing paper next to the painted eggs. In addition, they paint the hen, again using the circular movements.

4



Have the pupils cut out eyes, beaks and a chicken crest from the coloured paper. They stick these onto the chick and the chicken. Then they paint the chicken's legs and the surrounding area.
