

# WHAT TIME IS IT?

from age 7

preparation time: 5 min

duration: 30 - 45 min

math

## MATERIALS

- Air-drying clay in two colours such as Creall Do & Dry
- Skewers
- Clay tools
- Clay roller
- Round object of approx. 15 cm diameter

## LEARNING OBJECTIVE

Learning to read and indicate times on an analogue clock.



# WHAT TIME IS IT?

1



If there is no analogue clock in the room, show an example (on the IWB). What do the pupils notice? Does anyone know how to tell the time?

2



Give the pupils 2 pieces of clay in different colours. They'll use one colour they make the dial, and the other the hands. Using the clay roller, they should roll out the clay. Then they'll use a round object to cut out the dial.

3



Have the children put a skewer in the centre of the dial and prick holes in the ends of the hands. The pupils can also write their own names on the dial.

4



The hands are placed around the skewer. Now they can practice telling the time! Once dry, the clock can be used again when teaching to read and indicate times.
